



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT UNDER PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 385-10(B)(7) AND 385-21 OF THE ZONING CODE OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO, JEFFERSON COUNTY WISCONSIN.

Please take notice that the Plan Commission of the City of Waterloo, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, acting under provisions of Chapter 385-10(B)(7) and 385-21 of the Zoning Code of the City of Waterloo, shall hold a public hearing on the matter of an application for a conditional use permit received from Nathan Galston, owner of the property located at 1311 Oak Street, Waterloo.

Monday July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013

On Monday June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2013 we had our monthly EMS training. The training was a Mass Casualty situation. The scenario was an active shooter at an event. The Waterloo Police Department was also present to train with us. In the training scenario there were 3 people injured, and the gunman had not been located. This training is focused on safety but also triaging to make sure that the patient most critical gets transported first. One of the patients was the shooter and he still had another weapon on him. EMS responders had to triage the patients and try to find the weapon before they got wounded. This training is to open the view and make sure they check everything and everyone to make sure it is safe prior to entering a situation.

On Monday June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2013 we had our monthly Fire training. The training was 4 different scenarios. 1<sup>st</sup> part was hydrant hookups. This is where the engine or ladder crew comes up to a hydrant, grabs the hydrant bag and wraps the large diameter hose around the hydrant when the apparatus drives to the scene. They hook up and get water to the apparatus within 2 min. The 2<sup>nd</sup> part was drafting. Drafting is where the portable tanks are set out and the tenders dump water in the tank and the engine pulls the water from the tank. This training is a good refresher so when we do have to fight a fire with no hydrant we can get water within 2 min. The 3<sup>rd</sup> part was Aerial operations. The operators for the ladder truck have to know where and how to set up so the equipment can be used properly. The 4<sup>th</sup> part was Blitz Fire Attack. This training is with a newer piece of equipment. It is a master stream device which will allow us to set this up with 1-2 firefighters and one can work it. This gives us large water and quick attack to the fire.
