RESOLUTION #2021-39 Adopting Ward Boundaries in Accordance With Section §5.15 of the Wisconsin State Statutes

The Common Council of the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin does hereby resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of Waterloo is required to establish wards in accordance with Section §5.15 of the Wisconsin State Statutes, and;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council does hereby create five wards as follows:

1. **Ward One** – shall be a portion of Supervisory District #1 and shall make up Aldermanic District #1. It shall consist of the area bounded by a line drawn from the intersection of North Monroe Street and Clarkson Road east to Heil Street, south on Heil Street To Portland Road. The line shall continue in a southwesterly direction along Portland Road to the Maunesha River where it is to align with census blocks with the Maunesha River as the boundary, traveling southwesterly along the river aligning and otherwise with census blocks to the intersection of Hendricks Street and Bishop Circle. The line will continue east at the intersection of Hendricks Street and Bishop Circle, then south on Francis Lane and east on Tremaine Lane and south to Gregor Lane to East Madison Street, continuing west to North Monroe Street, continuing north on North Monroe Street, east on Boorman Street, north on Park Avenue, west along Spring Street to Lum Avenue, north to Henry Street, then west to North Monroe Street and continuing north back to the intersection of North Monroe Street and Clarkson Road.

2. **Ward Two** – shall be a portion of Supervisory District # 1 and shall make up Aldermanic District #2. It shall consist of an area bounded by a line drawn from the intersection of North Monroe Street and Clarkson Road west to northwest municipal boundary, south along the municipal boundary Canal Road, continuing on that road to the intersection of Canal Road and West Madison Street. At this point the line will continue in a northeasterly direction along West Madison Street to the first point where West Madison Street intersects with the Maunesha River. The line is to continue north along the Maunesha River in alignment with the river and census blocks until the river next intersects West Madison Street. It continues east on West Madison Street to the intersection of Madison Street and Monroe Street. It proceeds north to Boorman Street, then east on Boorman Street to Park Avenue, proceeding north along Park Avenue to Spring Street, then east on Spring Street, proceeding west to North Monroe Street and continuing north on North Monroe Street back to the intersection of North Monroe Street and continuing north on North Monroe Street back to the intersection of North Monroe Street and Clarkson Road.

3. **Ward Three** – shall be a portion of Supervisory District # 1 and shall make up Aldermanic District #3. It shall consist of an area bounded by a line drawn from the intersection of South Monroe Street and Waterloo Road west to the southwest municipal boundary, north to Canal Road, proceeding easterly along that road to the intersection of Canal Road and West Madison Street. At this point it will continue in a northeasterly direction along West Madison Street to the first point where West Madison Street intersects with the Maunesha River. The line is to continue north remaining in alignment with the Maunesha River and census blocks until the river next intersects West Madison Street. Once back to West Madison Street, the line is to continue east on Madison Street to the intersection of East Madison Street and South Washington Street. It then is to continue south on South Washington Street until it intersects with the railroad corridor. At the corridor it is to proceed west until it reaches a point aligning with census blocks and with South Monroe

Street. At this point the line is to proceed directly south to the intersection of South Monroe Street and South Washington Street, proceeding south until it reaches the starting point of the intersection of South Monroe Street and Waterloo Road.

4. Ward Four – shall be a portion of Supervisory District # 1 and shall make up a portion of Aldermanic District 4 & 5. It shall consist of an area bounded by a line drawn beginning at the intersection of Clarkson Road & Heil Street then south on Heil Street to Portland Road. The line shall continue in a southwesterly direction Portland Road until it reaches the Maunesha River. Aligning with census blocks with the Maunesha River as a boundary, it is to travel westerly along the river and otherwise according to the census block to the intersection of Hendricks Street and Bishop Circle. The line is then to proceed east on Bishop Circle south on Francis Lane east on Tremaine Lane and south to Gregor Lane and then to the intersection of Gregor Lane and East Madison Street. The line is to continue east on East Madison Street to the intersection of East Madison Street and Maple Drive continuing in a northerly direction along Maple Drive to its terminus, then aligning with census tracks, in an easterly direction to the east municipal boundary. The line then proceeds north to the northeast municipal boundary and then west to the beginning point, the intersection of Clarkson Road and Heil Street

5. **Ward Five** – shall be a portion of Supervisory District # 2 and shall make up a portion of Aldermanic District 4 & 5. It shall consist of an area bounded by a line drawn from the southeast municipal boundary then east to the intersection of Waterloo Road and South Monroe Street. The line shall continue north to the intersection of South Washington Street and South Monroe Street. It will continue north on South Monroe Street until it intersects with the railroad corridor, at which point it will proceed east to the intersection of the rail corridor and South Washington Street. It will proceed north to East Madison Street, then east on East Madison Street to the intersection of East Madison Street and the Maple Drive. It will proceed north to the northern terminus of Maple Drive and proceed in an easterly direction in alignment with census blocks until it intersects with the eastern municipal boundary. It will then proceed south to the starting point, the southeast municipal boundary.

6. Wards 4 & 5 combine to create one Aldermanic District.

7. Wards 1, 2,3 & 4 shall comprise all of County Supervisory District 1 and Ward 5 shall be part of County Supervisory District 2.

8. The city population of 3,492 shall be divided into wards as follow:

Ward 1 – 898 Ward 2 – 879 Ward 3 – 821 Ward 4 – 323 Ward 5 – 571

9. This change in ward boundaries shall be effective with the Spring Election in 2022.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above ward boundaries are outlined and identified on the attached map (Attachment 1) and on the attached census block lists (Attachment 2) which are incorporated and made a part hereof, and that the map is generated using WISE-LR software in order to incorporate the underlying census block numbers within each ward.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for all voting purposes, the above wards will be combined, using one common polling place, which will be 136 North Monroe Street, Waterloo Wisconsin. The polling place as required by law is located in Ward One (1).

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The initiation and accomplishment of the improvement will be subject to the applicable federal, state and local laws, administrative policy and program rules, ordinances, standards, and contract bidding requirements. Please note that if any portion of an improvement is funded using federal funds (including design, real estate, or other related work activities), the entire improvement will be subject to federal requirements. All components of the improvement must be defined in the environmental document if any portion of the project is federally funded.
- 2. The construction of the improvement will be in accordance with the appropriate standards unless an exception to standards is granted by the state prior to construction. The entire cost of the improvement not constructed to standards will be the responsibility of the Municipality/County unless such exception is granted.
- 3. The Municipality/County will assume all responsibility for complying with all applicable environmental requirements for the improvement.
- 4. The work, which is eligible for state participation will be administered by the Municipality/County. The authority for the state to delegate this responsibility is described in ch. Trans 206.
- 5. All contracts will be let by competitive bid and awarded to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with the provisions of s.86.31 Wis. Stats. and all other municipal/county bidding requirements.
- 6. State financing will be limited to up to 90 percent (90%) participation in eligible items or to the limit approved for the improvement whichever is less.
- 7. Payments to the Municipality/County will be made after the improvement is completed, and the contractor(s) fully reimbursed.
- 8. In order to guarantee the Municipality's foregoing agreements to pay the State, the Municipality, through its above duly authorized officers or officials, agrees and authorizes the State to set off and withhold the required reimbursement amount as determined by the State from any moneys otherwise due and payable by the State to the Municipality.
- 9. The Municipality/County will keep records of the cost of the improvement together with letting documents and will have them available for inspection by representatives of the state and will furnish copies when requested.
- 10. The design and construction of the improvement must be certified by a registered professional engineer, if the cost of the improvement exceeds \$65,000.
- 11. Federal Single Audits of Local Government Units:
 - a) The Municipality/County shall have a single organization audit performed by a qualified independent auditor if required to do so under federal law and regulations. (See Federal Circular No. A-133)
 - b) This audit shall be performed in accordance with Federal Circular A-133 issued by the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and state single audit guidelines issued by the Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA).
 - c) The Municipality/County will keep records of costs of construction, inspection tests and maintenance done by it to enable the State to review the amount and nature of the expenditure for those purposes. Such accounting records and any other related records shall be subject to a project review or audit as directed by the Department within ten (10) years of project closing.
- 12. The Municipality/County will maintain, at its own cost and expense, all portions of the project that lie within its jurisdiction and will make ample provision of such maintenance as long as the road remains open to traffic.
- 13. This agreement is subject to the availability of State funds appropriated for this program. The continuance of this agreement beyond the limits of funds already available to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation is contingent upon appropriation of the necessary funds by the Wisconsin Legislature and the Governor. (Reference 66 OAG 408; State ex rel. LaFollette v. Reuter, 36 Wis. 2d 96, 119 [1967])
- 14. In accordance with the State's sunset policy for LRIP projects, the subject improvement must be constructed and submitted for reimbursement within three biennium.
