3a. CLERK/TREASURER'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT REPORT

- Website Revisions Working with Jeanne Ritter to update website incorporating in Welcoming New Resident's Material. More time need to advance this. Some Google Drive data is aged, am trying to find a home for it on website.

ii. Grant Tracking.

- City Council determined that \$450,000 LRIP grant for Hendricks and associated areas would not be used in 2022, with Mayor saying 2024. This grant is available to us because we linked it to economic improvements, we are pursuing for 333 Portland Road. Customizing these improvements to optimized benefit for a 333 Portland Road end user is recommended.
- 2. I participated in the annual County Highway meeting of communities to divide up the county's share of state MSILT Program dollars.
 - a. Waterloo to receive \$16,355 of the \$90,082 in program dollars for use on 2023 highway project (based on population).
 - b. We have until November 15th to submit for the County for its review and prioritization for the following WisDOT programs
 - i. MSILT (Item 2a above).
 - ii. STP-U, we likely don't have a good project for this (competitive)
 - iii. LRIP -Supplemental (competitive, with scoring points valued for safety; high traffic volume; economic development; bike/ped component; historic site)
 - iv. LRIP Discretionary (competitive, with scoring points valued for safety; high traffic volume; economic development; bike/ped component; historic site)

- 1. Treyburn Farms. Lot 2 for sale, no leads. Lot 3 closing scheduled for November 1, 2021.
- 2. 575 West Madison Street. Property owner has job opening posted for site manager.
- 692 West Madison Street. Todd Nelson provided with process instructions for pursuing rezoning and conditional use permit for residential development at this site. Waiting on submittal for Plan Commission.
- 4. Hawthorn & Stone Development Agreement. No activity since City Council takes no action after discussion of delinquent developer fees. Invoice for unpaid interest sent the Friday after City Council discussion.

- In this email I am sharing preliminary data and a preliminary recommendation to the CDA regarding Impact Fees for the 10/19 meeting.

A. RECOMMENDATION.

Like Marshall, Waterloo has had success in attracting private investment by pitching zero fees. Sending a clear signal to the private sector has had benefits. In the current development climate, there may be interest on the part of appointed and elected Waterloo officials to reinstitute one or more Impact Fees. This recommendation assumes that is the case.

- 1. Focused solely on parks at this time, a facility needs assessment would be written, primarily by the Clerk/Treasurer's office, with Kunkel Engineering Group certifying the required sections/aspects of the assessment per state statutes.
 - Why just parks? It has clearly identified future capital plans, other municipal areas have plans that are less clear or less documented as needed.

- 2. Refresh Section 380-50 Impact Fees to make current these actions.
- Reinstitute a Parks Impact Fee to offset the capital cost of planned public parks facilities attributable to new development (currently identified as DeYoung Farm Park, South Side Park & 720 West Madison Street). The 2021 Comprehensive Plan Update document and other existing planning documents would be the lead adopted points of reference for the fee.

The base calculation would be: [[parks project dollar value attributable to new development] / [2022-2029 population growth estimate]] * [estimated # of residents per Residential Equivalent Unit] = Impact Fee dollar value per Residential Equivalent Unit]

B. BACKGROUND & DATA.

- <u>Section 380-50 Impact Fees of the municipal code</u> contains the enabling code, which will need to be refreshed with the re-institution of any Impact Fee
- UW-Stevens Point Center for Land Use Education provides <u>background material</u> about Impact Fees.
- I have an email to Waterloo Utilities Engineer Ben Heidemann which includes Barry Sorenson, after talking with Barry about the possibility of a Sewer Impact Fee. Waterloo Utilities may or may not be in a position to reinstitute Impact Fees for sewer or water. Action does not need to be done all at once. An Impact Fee benefiting the Sewer Utility or the Water Utility may be reinstituted at a later date.
- Area Impact Fee Survey. Below I have estimated an average by community for a Residential Equivalent Unit, a concept already adopted in §380-50.
