Executive Summary

MADISON REGION ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP

Waterloo, Wisconsin, is a community located in Jefferson County. While it is a smaller city, Waterloo's economy is influenced by its position between urban centers like Madison and Milwaukee. The local economy is driven by a mix of manufacturing, agriculture, and small businesses. This report provides an overview of the current economic conditions in Waterloo, highlighting key sectors, employment trends, and future opportunities for growth.

Economic Overview

- Population: Approximately 3,492 residents (most recent Census data)
- Median Age: 40.9
- Median Household Income: \$72,666 (Census data estimate)
- Employment Rate: 69.2%
- Unemployment Rate: 3.2% (as of August 2024)
- Key Industries: Manufacturing, agriculture, retail, and services

Key Economic Sectors

- Manufacturing makes up a large majority of the jobs in Waterloo. More than one fourth of all jobs in the area are manufacturing related. Manufacturing jobs increased more than any other in Waterloo over the last five years.
- Government jobs are the second most frequent in Waterloo. They have seen a 16% decrease over the last five years.
- Agriculture jobs are the third most frequent in Waterloo's zip code. Overall, agricultural jobs make up 5.5% more of the industry in Waterloo than the rest of Jefferson County.

As you can see from all the data above, the number of jobs in the area has remained relatively constant, while the number of establishments has begun to level out since after the pandemic. Manufacturing jobs are the largest in their growth, which coincides with the importance manufacturing has in Waterloo. The service industry is steadily growing to recover from the pandemic, and finance and insurance work is becoming increasingly popular in Waterloo.
