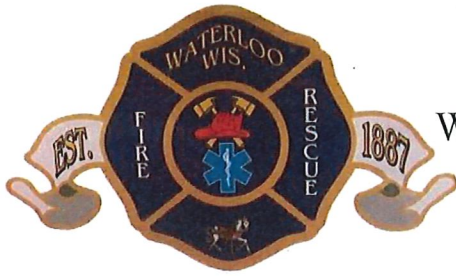

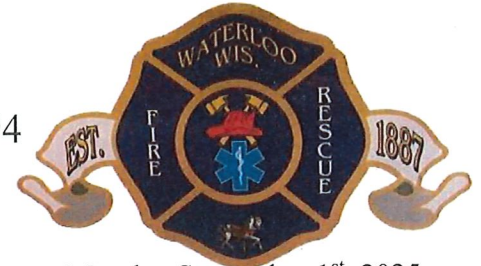

Monday September 1st, 2025

On Monday August 4th, 2025 we had our monthly Operators training. Training was on aerial set up, hooking hydrants, cross lay pulls and hydrant inspections. Positioning and setting up the ladder on different buildings with in the city. With this we are pre-planning those buildings to be able to have the best outcome in an emergency. The Engine crew went out and hooked hydrants throughout the city, timing the crew and making sure the hydrants are good with no problems. With hooking the hydrants, the firefighters also pulled the cross lays to make sure they were getting a good hose layout to have no kinks in the line. Ladder crew checked hydrant throughout the city and found some that need some attention to make sure we can hook them up quickly.

On Monday August 11th, 2025 we had our monthly EMS training. Training was on cardiac, reviewed how the heart works with the paths and structures of the heart when the blood flows through it. Reviewed 3 causes of heart malfunction, pump failure, low fluid and vessel problems. Reviewed disease process and trauma with how they affect the heart. Went through the meds and their effects on the heart. We also trained on possibly new car seats for pediatrics and patient lifting techniques with demo lifting equipment.

On Monday August 18th, 2025 we had our monthly Fire training. Training was on hose advancement through a second story. First scenario was second story window. Crews pulled the extended lay off the back of the truck and placed a ladder to the window and needed to figure the best way to get the hose bundle up and through the window. Second scenario was second story door. Crews pulled the cross lay and had to figure when to drop the bundle and stretch the line.

We have 3 new members that joined. Keegan Lauersdorf for firefighter. Katie Sanicola for EMS
Antone Baumgartner for EMS

Events this month: The Police Department, Fire Department and park worked together to have a community event called Fill the Squad. This event is to get donations for school supplies to help families and schools have the supplies they need.

Our EMS had a crew go to the Dodge County Fair to work in the first aid tent. Most Dodge County EMS departments take shifts to help at the fair.

Football season has begun and when there is a home varsity game an ambulance crew be there for standby.

WLOO CATV Monthly Manager's Report

for the month of August 2025

WLOO staff continued the work of tagging WLOO's YouTube videos, including archived videos, that was begun in July.

Director Sparks has made significant progress in unpacking and sorting stored equipment into four categories: Keep, Repair, Components Missing, and Sell/Discard. The sorting process will include creating a proper inventory list.

The WLOO Crew got footage at the Fill The Squad event on August 12th. A feature film will be produced like WLOO did in 2024, as soon as the Police Department provides drone footage and The Bridge provides some releases.

Jayden Sparks began developing framework for a series on arcades and arcade games. She anticipates filming and producing a pilot episode in September. WLOO crew member Teana Nighthawk will be out on Weiner and Kraut day collecting raw footage for a feature film. Laura Coting invited Joanna Kurylo to develop the framework for a series about starting small businesses, intended for a high school audience. Joanna hopes to have a framework ready for WLOO's consideration sometime in October.

WLOO's equipment is working well, and has been improved a little since last month. Jayden reported improvement in the sound quality of Council meeting videos, after some careful troubleshooting.

Michelle Nighthawk was hired at the end of the month. Although she was hired as a part time videographer, Michelle will be doing various assigned support tasks behind the scenes instead of recording events. Michelle has a lot of professional experience developing training and SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) documentation. She will assist Jayden with developing proper station documents and with video tagging. Michelle's resume has strong management, budgetary, and liaising elements.

Expenditures to date amount to 34.3% of the annual budget, although 2/3 of the fiscal year has elapsed. While this is good news for the goal of rebuilding WLOO's financial cushion after several years of planned deficit spending, the down side is that the surplus is due to fewer manhours than projected. Nevertheless, the labor shortage isn't completely debilitating. WLOO is meeting its baseline commitments to record and broadcast Common Council and School Board meetings and occasional community events.

WHEREAS, the City and Developer are in negotiations for a potential agreement whereby the City would convey the Property to the Developer, and it would redevelop the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires, and the City is willing to provide, assurance to the Developer that the City will not convey the Property to a party other than the Developer, or its assigns, for a period of 90 days to allow time for the City and Developer to attempt to negotiate such an agreement to redevelop the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby mutually acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Sale Freeze. The City shall not sell, convey, or transfer title of the Property to any party other than the Developer, or the Developer's assigns, for a period of 90 days commencing on the Effective Date (the "**Freeze Period**"). After the expiration of the Freeze Period, or earlier termination of this Agreement as provided below, the City shall be free to sell, convey, or transfer title to the Property as it decides in its sole discretion.

2. Negotiation. During the Freeze Period, the Parties shall negotiate in good faith in an attempt to reach an agreement whereby the Developer would redevelop the Property. The Parties are under no obligation to reach such an agreement, and mutually acknowledge that both Parties, or either Party, may withdraw from such negotiations at any time, for any reason, or no reason. If either Party so withdraws, they shall give written notice to the other Party, and this Agreement shall terminate as of the date of such notice. If the negotiations result in an agreement, the terms of such shall be memorialized in a subsequent agreement between the Parties, which agreement shall supersede and replace this Agreement.

3. No Partnership. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create any co-partnership, principal and agent, joint venture, or other similar relationship between the Parties hereto, and no Party may incur debts or liabilities in the name, or on behalf, of any other Party unless expressly approved by the Party to be bound thereby in a written instrument signed by such Party.


